New Volunteer Clearance Requirements: Due to new state regulations, all school volunteers, age 18 and older, are now required to have two clearances: Criminal history (Act 34) and Child Abuse history (Act 151). Each clearance is free for volunteers, as of July 25, 2015. This law took effect July 1, 2015, so all church, school, and early learning center volunteers who have direct contact with children must have these clearances prior to volunteering. This would include but is not limited to classroom helpers, library aides, lunch aide, field trip chaperones, etc. These clearances must be on file in the office and renewed every 36 months.

Just a reminder: if individuals already have clearances within the last 3 years, due to State law, we MUST see the originals before making copies. We cannot accept copies from any individual.

PLEASE NOTE.... Effective December 31, 2014 VOLUNTEERS ARE NO LONGER REQUIRED TO SUBMIT A COPY OF THE PROCESSED RESULTS OF THEIR "REQUEST FOR CREMINAL RECORD" OR A COPY OF THEIR FBI FINGERPRINT RESULTS AS STATED ON THE "PENNSYLVANIA CHILD ABUSE HISTORY CLEARANCE" FORM UNDER "PURPOSE OF CLEARANCE."
