#### Lead Us Not Into Temptation

This newsletter finds us smack-dab in the middle of Lent. Resisting temptation is a signature feature of this holy season. The 40-day temptation of Jesus by Satan in the wilderness signals the beginning of Lent, and the 40 days of Lent (Ash Wednesday to "Palm Saturday" minus the Sundays) is patterned after that time Jesus was tempted.

We have all sorts of ideas about temptation, from the seven deadly sins to eating meat on Fridays. What is the real gist of temptation? It's not so much that we don't give in. We all know we will. Eventually. We are not Jesus, and we will all succumb to temptation. The real temptation test comes after we have denied, erred, fallen, indulged, cheated, caved and abandoned. The devil knows we are easy pickings. And that we are. It's our current, natural state. We need not be so surprised at this!

When we have sinned, will we return to the Lord? THAT is the temptation. We will consider ourselves self-condemned and irredeemable? Will we flee from the face of the Lord never to return, like Judas? Then we have failed. On the contrary, if we, like Peter who denied knowing Jesus and the other disciples who abandoned the Lord in Gethsemane, remember the Lord's mercy is forever and for all, and return to the Lord, we are proven worthy.

When you do the laundry, all sorts of things are hiding in the pockets of your clothes. Money, receipts, prescriptions, Kleenex, pens, etc. If those go through the wash, clothes may not come out so clean. Especially if the pen makes it to the dryer. Lent is a time to come before the Lord and empty all our pockets and be washed clean. We empty out all our fears, doubts, frustrations, unanswered questions, complaints, and failures. Jesus exchanges them for perfect and complete forgiveness and cleansing of our souls. If Lent teaches us how to do that, then it has been a success! God grant this to us all.

#### 2023-2025 MISSION GRANT NO. 4 FORTIFYING FAITH IN THOSE WITH VISION IMPAIRMENT LUTHERAN BRRAILLE WORKERS \$100,000

There are millions of people throughout the world who are blind or visually impaired and are seeking to strengthen their faith as they cope with isolation and deal with physical, mental, and spiritual struggles. They desire to be able to read the words of the Lord themselves, so that they can feel

and learn about the love of God and the salvation of Jesus. Even with advancements in technology, they still have difficulties accessing scriptural and theologically-related reading materials. It is estimated that approximately 95% of the 253 million people around the world with moderate to severe vision impairment are unchurched, yet when it comes to ministering to this community, there are fewer than a handful of Christian organizations reaching out to provide help. Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) continues to provide Bibles and other Christian materials in braille or specialized large print to help this under reached population feel connected to the family of Christ and grow in their faith. Those who have received and benefited from LBW materials have shared that without these volumes, they might never have learned to read and obtain basic life skills needed to survive in the world to-day. Lutheran Braille Workers has been freely supplying materials in large print and braille to people who are visually impaired for over eighty years. This grant will help with the formatting, producing, and distributing of fifty to one hundred new Scripturebased materials and add to the LBW collection of resources to meet the spiritual and emotional needs of recipients with vision impairments around the world. Some of the materials include Lutheran Hour Ministries Connect Booklets and American missionary books from Mission Nation Publishing. There is also cooperation with other LCMS partners, such as Concordia Publishing House and the LCMS Synodical Headquarters to gain access to more titles as needed. This grant will develop and provide materials beyond the Bible that will help Christians develop and strengthen their faith.
